

Grevillea Coral Baby™ Grevillea lavandulacea x chrysophaea

No seahorses hiding in these coral flowers but heres another winner from the Austraflora stable. Small and compact (40cm H x 80cm W), its a lovely little shrub with fine dense foliage, and the flowers bloom from winter to spring, giving the honeyeaters a great lunch site. In a container on a deck or patio, the subtle beauty of Coral Baby $^{\text{TM}}$ can be appreciated in detail, or plant it en masse to add its charm to small gardens. An occasional light trim will keep it neat and encourage even denser flowering; well drained soils in cool temperate to sub tropical and semi arid climates are suitable, frost is not a problem, and with a little protection from salt winds it will do well at the seaside.
